
DANGER AHEAD!

The number of pets with heartworm may be BIGGER than we think!

2/3¹ of U.S. households have pets, including more than 100 million dogs and cats.



Heartworm disease is one of the most common, and serious, diseases in dogs and cats. If dogs and cats aren't regularly seen by veterinarians, heartworm diagnoses can be missed, and heartworm preventives not prescribed.

The doctor doesn't see them now.

More than 1 in 4 U.S. pet owners

don't take their pets

for annual veterinary visits.²



Too few test takers.
Only 1 in 2 dog owners

say they **REGULARLY** have their dogs tested for heartworms.⁴



Homeless pets are unprotected.

Millions of dogs and cats are homeless and have little or no access to veterinary care.
